Finally, I would provide a farewell sermon on January 23, 2022.

Thank you for your continued support and kindness. I have felt cared for and learned a great deal from you all. I am excited about what is in store for Broadmoor as you continue to reach out your tendrils of compassion. As the quote goes, "Mission is Broadmoor's middle name." Broadmoor Presbyterian Church is God's hands and feet in a world that so desperately needs to feel loved. The Spirit of God is with Broadmoor. It dances alongside you, sings out with you in worship, and rests beside you as night falls.

Advent Reflections

First Sunday of Advent, November 28

HOPE - "The Magi"

Read: Matthew 2:16

These wealthy Wise Men followed a star and came from a very long distance. Scholars think they came from the area of ancient Babylon or present day Iran. They were learned men and advisors to kings. They were educated and probably were familiar with the Jewish scriptures and had read about the expected coming of their Messiah. We are not sure how many Magi came, possibly more than three. They had to travel thousands of miles through desert areas and, usually, people traveled in large caravan groups. They came with HOPE that they would find what they were looking for.

- Do we feel the **HOPE** that comes with knowing the Messiah has come?
- Do we go out of our way to share this **HOPE** and promise with others? How?
- What kinds of things or feelings do we **HOPE** for at Christman?

Make a start to hang on your tree or in your window to symbolize **HOPE**.

PEACE - "The Shepherds"

Read: Luke 2:8-12

The traditional "Shepherds' Field," where the angels appeared to the shepherds, is about three-quarters of a mile east of Bethlehem. Luke is the only gospel where we read about the shepherds. Being a shepherd was a lonely life. They guarded the sheep and slept under the stars. It was a **PEACE**ful life, for the most part. David had been a shepherd and had found time to ponder and later compose some of the Psalms we can read today. The shepherd's **PEACE** was interrupted, that night, with the coming of the angels. What a magnificent spectacle that must have been! They, like the Magi, and as indicated by the scripture reading, may have known about a coming Messiah. They were anxious to see this new King.

- Do we feel **PEACE** during this busy holiday season? Do we take time for it?
- Have we ever experienced the **PEACE** and beauty found while looking up at the clear night sky?
- Do we feel God's PEACE in our daily lives? What can bring us to God's PEACE?

Write a prayer asking God to bless us with His **PEACE** during this busy season and into the year ahead.

Third Sunday of Advent, December 12

JOY - "The Angels"

Read: Luke 2:13-14

Angels were God's special messengers and are found in many places in the Bible. An angel spoke to Abraham (Gen. 22:11-18) and his son Isaac was saved. The angel Gabriel came to Zechariah, foretelling the JOYous birth of his son, John (John the Baptist) (Luke 1:11-13). We read that the angel Gabriel came to Mary, too, and told her she would give birth to the Messiah (Luke 1:26-32). At the end of Jesus' earthly life, angels appeared at the tomb and spoke to the two Mary's (Matt. 28:1-7) (Luke 24:1-8). They heralded the news that Jesus had arisen! What wonderful JOY they must have felt! We read that these messengers announced Jesus' birth to the shepherd with great JOY. We, too, can be filled with JOY as we realize God's presence in our lives through His son, Jesus Christ.

LOVE - "The Nativity - Birth of Jesus"

Read: Luke 2:1-7, 15-20 & Matthew 2:10-12

Jesus was born in the small town of Bethlehem. His parents had to travel on foot and by donkey from Nazareth. They traveled over 75 miles all the way down to their home town of Bethlehem to be counted in the census...what a long trip. When they arrived, there was no room in the inn. So, our Lord was born in a stable, in a manger. The shepherds left their sheep and came, and the Magi, who had traveled thousands of miles following a star, also came. They came to see and worship this new King. People from different walks of life bowed down in asw and reverence. The Magi brought precious gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh.
