Time Flies



Dear Church,

It has been just over six months that I have been your interim pastor.

Wow. That was fast! This picture is my "I can't believe time has gone this fast" face. :-)

Soon the Mission Study will be approved by San Francisco Presbytery, Broadmoor will elect a Pastor Nominating Committee, and the search for your next installed pastor will begin!



I suppose this is as good a time as any to lift up a few things that I have learned about this community, both for places of great faithfulness as well as areas that you may need to address over the next years.

There are a great many things that I could talk about, but let me just lift up three in the form of questions?

Where is your abundance? Too often when we talk about the future, we focus on what we do not have rather than what we do in our church: young people, money, people power, time, energy, etc. As you live in community over the next months in preparation for what is to come, every time that you find yourself lamenting the absence of something, think about what is in the present and give thanks for them: your hospitality, your willingness to have honest conversations, and a building.

What do you need to let go of? To be blunt, if Broadmoor is to move forward in meaningful ways, some things will have to change. I wish I could tell you exactly what these things are, but the reality is that if you knew, you would probably have already let these things go. That said, there will be times in the future when you are going to have to practice letting things go in order to open up. This could be in worship, or about a program, or a responsibility that has been held for years, but there will always be something. I also wish that I could guarantee that when you let something go, the thing you expect to take its place will, in fact, take its place. We all know that there are no guarantees, so you will simply be asked and called to keep accepting the challenge to let go and remain open to God's possibilities.

Where will you find joy? This is my favorite question because the church is supposed to be about new life and hope. If being part of the church is sucking your soul dry, maybe it is time to reassess how and if you should be involved. I would never want someone to stay purely out of obligation, guilt, or shame, but rather someone should be part of a community because, even through the tough times, there is life here. This question may be the most important one of the three because I guarantee that there will be times in the future, even as you are doing the hard work, you might not be happy. Please remember that happiness is not the same as joy. Being happy is fine and there are times when we just need to be happy, but being filled with joy recognizes that there is something deeply transformational and life-giving about the ways we are being a church. Happiness will wane over time, but joy will sustain you through the hard times into the future. So the next time you are feeling "unhappy" about something, dig deeper and find where there is joy.

Okay, there you go, some questions to chew on for the day. I hope that they will inspire some good reflections and conversations as individuals and community.

These first six months really have been a joy and I look forward to the next six!

Beloved wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, cousin, and friend, Shirley passed away peacefully in her home on April 5, 2018 at the age of 90 surrounded by family.

Shirley was born in Joplin, Missouri on June 11, 1927 to her parents Victor and Clara Langston. She is survived by three children, Judy (John), Robert, and Rick (Erika); 8 grandchildren Nikole (Chris), Jamie, Michele (Carlos), Lannette, Joshua, Chris (Yvonne), Erik (Marie), and Jessica (Joe); 13 great-grandchildren Chad, Brandi (Steve), Jeffery, Patrick, Lucas, Alexa, Taylor, David, Braedyn, Jacob, Sierra, Alyssa, and Austin); cousins Joanna (Peter) and Naomi. She was preceded in death by her husband Gordon and son David (Linda).

Shirley lived in Leavenworth, Kansas until she was 12. She had a very happy childhood and spent several years living with her mother and grandparents. Shirley and her mother moved to San Francisco to live with her aunt. She attended Dudley Stone School and met her life long friend Donna Johnson (Hammerstrom). She attended Polytechnic High and spent her time after school at the beach with friends at Kelly's Cove near the cliff house. After she graduated, she got a iob as a copy girl at the San Francisco Examiner and met her future husband. Gordon, there. They married in 1946 in the Swedenborgian Church in San Francisco. Shirley and Gordon moved to Colma after three of their children (Judy, Bob, and Dave) were born. They made many close friends in their neighborhood. A few years after moving to Colma, they had their fourth child (Rick) and began going to Broadmoor Presbyterian Church in Daly City. Shirley became very involved with the Presbyterian Women. Through the Presbyterian Women she was involved in many philanthropic endeavors including Cameron House in San Francisco. Shirley, Gordon, and their children began camping at Lake Pillsbury. Soon, their neighborhood friends, Jackie and Les Allen, Mary and Willie Healey, and Jane and Charlie Healey, along with all their children were going with them to Lake Pillsbury and they spent every glorious summer as the H.A.S.H. clan camping, boating, swimming, and sitting around campfires. Years of the H.A.S.H children growing up together at "the lake" turned into years of the H.A.S.H. grandchildren growing up together at "the lake". After decades of camping. Shirley and Gordon, with the help of their grown children and friends, built their own cabin at the lake and spent every moment they could up there. Shirley worked for See's Candy for more than 20 years retiring in the early 90's. Shirley and Gordon celebrated 50 years of marriage in 1996 and went on an exciting European trip. Sadly, Shirley's husband, Gordon, died in 1998. The support of family and friends and the help of her faith and the members of Broadmoor Presbyterian Church gave her comfort as she healed from her great loss. It was only 5 years later that she also lost her son David.

Shirley was a lover of books, fierce defender of the earth, educator about bees, herbs, and vitamins and spoke most fervently as their advocate to her children and grandchildren. She was always present for her family and those she considered family. She had many fast friends who she treasured dearly. We will miss her laughter, her love, her thoughtfulness, and her wisdom, but we will never forget her passion for life.
