



Glory to God

Dear Church,

You all are too funny.
You are also pretty amazing.

As I announced last Sunday, the Session of BPC recently approved the purchase of the new Presbyterian Hymnal. Published in 2013, it is an update from the 1990 blue hymnal that many of us have known for nearly three decades. I am excited about this resource for our worship as it has brought back some beloved favorites and added some amazing new hymns.

The story of the BPC hymnal is “funny” because I only mentioned the possibility in passing and within a week, an anonymous gift was given and more than 50% of the cost was already covered even before session could even discuss it. Now in some churches changing the hymnal could take months of discussion, could generate unneeded drama, and could be slowed by an unwillingness to change. And while we all have places that we can be stubborn, in this case, BPC adapted much faster than I had anticipated — amazing.

Yep, funny and amazing you are.

We will be purchasing 100 pew hymnals and four large print editions for now, but to do so we need your help to cover the rest of the cost. We intend to begin using the hymnal on December 2, the first Sunday in Advent, beginning the new church year by ushering in the use of a new hymnal.

Hymnals are \$15 each and you can designate it “In Honor of . . .” or “In Memory of . . .” a loved one or you can simply make it your gift to Broadmoor Presbyterian Church. There will be inserts in the Sunday bulletins through November 18th or you can contact Martha in the church office [bpcdcoffice@gmail.com] or (650) 755-0597. Please be sure to mark your checks or envelopes with “HYMNAL” and let us know your hymnals are being given in honor/memory of anyone.

I can't wait to dive into the 800 hymns —learn some new ones and revisit some classics— as we soon begin a new church year together.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS MINISTRY TEAM

RECYCLE—COMPOST—GARBAGE

Recycle bin— clean paper; cans; bottles; aluminum foil; plastic containers; plastic plates; plastic cups; plastic knives, fork and spoons. NO DIRTY PAPER PRODUCTS IN THE RECYCLE BIN!

Compost bin—food scraps; food-soiled paper (including paper plates, paper cups, paper napkins, pizza boxes, dirty cardboard.) NO PLASTIC , NO METAL, NO GLASS IN THE COMPOST BIN!

Garbage bin—plastic straws and stirrers, Styrofoam plates, Styrofoam cups, styrene products, broken glass, plastic wrappers.

The main drain in the bride's restroom flooded and O'Grady plumbing was called. They found a blockage and cleared a lot of wipes from the drain. While clearing the clogged drain they found a blockage that runs in front of the garbage area at the end of the cement. We are waiting for an estimate from O'Grady Plumbing. The cement and asphalt will need to be removed.

Dennis has replaced the screws in all of the Tweedie Hall chairs. He has put new covers on 20 of the chairs with 15 left to go. The faucet and soap dispenser in the Choir Room have been fixed. Mert Jones has given some fertilizer and moss control to Richard. Richard has applied it to the lawn, and the bottle brush bushes by the garbage area have been pruned.

The child care center has lost power. Pacific Gas and Electric came out and checked the power supply and couldn't find the problem. There is an electrical box outside the Geneva Room parking lot that had a blown fuse inside, which Eric John Gravem and Bill King replaced. A new fuse box door will be installed.
