

Session

As stated last month, Session met in a Special (Stated) meeting on July 21, 2019, for the purpose of approving the Terms of Call for the Rev. Dr. L. Don Smith. The date of August 18 was named for a meeting of the congregation, to seek their approval of this candidate presented by the Pastor Nominating Committee.

Guest Moderator Betty Delaney presided at the congregational meeting. Janice Asfoor, PNC liaison, read aloud the summary of the PNC's long and arduous search for a pastor. Bonnie Cobb, chair of the PNC, presented the motion. Meeting opened for discussion. Hearing no questions or comments, the Moderator called for a vote. Paper ballots were used for the vote. As Dennis Shreve went through the ballots one by one, he called out the votes, with these results: 26 yes, 9 no, 1 abstained.



After the vote, while waiting for the nominee's decision, PNC co-chair David Pajarit read aloud the Terms of Call, and only then did considerable discussion take place.

As stated last month, given our current budget, Broadmoor is limited to a half-time pastor. Our congregation must accept the facts. A half-time pastor means just that: he or she preaches only half the time, with other Sundays to be filled from pulpit supply or by inviting speakers from within the community or nongovernment agencies (NGOs).

The Session wishes to commend the PNC members for their diligence and time and effort in this challenging and difficult task: Bonnie Cobb, David Pajarit, Mariah Gravem, Janice Asfoor and Richard Murray. Thanks and kudos to each of you.

Session met in a Regular (Stated) meeting on August 22, 2019. The following motions were unanimously approved:

- To authorize Clark Pest Control to fumigate the building for \$30,800.00.
- To revise coffee hour assignments as follows: Presbyterian Women on the first Sunday of the month, open to families and volunteers on the second, Deacons on the third, with Fellowship to host on the fourth Sunday, plus fifth Sundays when they occur.
- To approve the revised schedule in rental fees charged for use of church facilities.
- To approve Villa Sinfonia's use of Broadmoor Presbyterian Church for the coming year, 2019/2020.

Plans for the future. Reverend InHo Kim of San Francisco Presbytery moderated the August 22 meeting of Session. He suggested our hiring a temporary pastor, one who might preach every other Sunday and provide some continuity and guidance here at Broadmoor. He has several individuals in mind and will provide their names and brief bios for us to consider. We are praying that BPC finds the best person to provide healing and lead us all on a faithful future.

The next regular (stated) meeting of Session will be Thursday, September 19, 7:00 p.m.

On August 18, our dear friend Jackie Hon passed away. We send our deepest sympathy




