We were a bit distracted last year when our church's anniversary came about.

Yes, Broadmoor Presbyterian Church, established May 1949, not only reached the significant age 70 but is beyond that now, at age 71! COVID-19 restrictions currently prevent the really joyous celebration we would wish to have. Perhaps a review of the ministers who have guided us through these decades will stir your memories of days past and serve as a reminder of the many joys we shared.

The beginning portion of this list is taken from the church's 50th-anniversary celebration, a festive dinner held May 22, 1999, in Tweedie Hall. Beyond special recognitions, the program featured Ken Gillespie's presentation, "Sand Dunes to Sanctuary." Appreciation was extended to Dennis Shreve for preparing the steak and chicken portion of our meal, and to Alverna Snodgrass for making the anniversary banner for the sanctuary. Fifteen people served on the 50th-anniversary committee.

Reflections

Dena Cuyjet

Since I was feeling the effects of COVID and having a difficult time concentrating due to feeling rundown, I asked Laith, my 19-year-old son, to write an introduction for teaching my new upcoming nursing class. This is what he wrote for me....

"Hello Class, I am your professor, Dena Cuyjet. You may call me Dena. I am currently COVID positive, quarantining with my family who is also COVID positive. As a nurse practitioner, I have prepared myself to serve my community as best as I can no matter what the circumstances. Last week I was in one of the most uncomfortable states of health- I was not only physically symptomatic with chills, muscle aches, and headache, but I was emotionally worried about the impact that being COVID + means as a steward for public health. For the last 10 days, our family has had to adapt to the many changes this virus brings; but, being adaptable is one of the most important traits a human being can

possess. Whether that means adjusting to being in guarantine, in the classroom, in the hospital or clinic, or to our changing social climate. As a Palestinian woman, I am still learning my role in dismantling systemic racism, homophobia. transphobia, sexism, discrimination based on age, class, religion, and citizenship. It has been uncomfortable at times, and I expect it to get even more uncomfortable. I do not say this to frighten you, I say this to prepare you. Every single person in this class has made it through a rigorous nursing program. (I say this because my son is currently struggling in a nursing program). Being uncomfortable leads to growth and progress, staying comfortable is a form of ignorance. Whether working with a patient who has different opinions and ideals than you, or seeing a protest on police brutality end in police brutality, this world will throw you into situations you never thought you would be in.

The best way to adapt is to move slowly, listen, observe, learn, read, and inform yourself on the reality that is systemic bias and discrimination in healthcare. This change will not come fast, therefore you need to take it day by day. The role of a Nurse practitioner working in pediatrics must take into account the social and emotional needs of the entire family. It is important not to only address the medical chief complaint, but also the food insecurity, housing needs, as well as assessing the Adverse childhood Events scores of the patient. Today we begin our journey into learning about Common and Acute Pediatric Conditions for the advanced nurse practitioner."

On March 1st, the company that I work for sent out procedures that mandated all employees to continue to follow developments with respect to the coronavirus outbreak in North America. The news was very unsettling and alarming as more Covid-19 cases were reported and the number of deaths was rising. My family and I were not fully aware of how to prepare for this pandemic nor how to deal with it if one of us contracted the virus.

During the shelter in place mandate, I have been going to work almost every day; I am considered an essential worker as I oversee health care and medical facilities for the company. One of the biggest challenges I have encountered was not coronavirus so much, but fear, anxiety, misinformation in all the chaos in the first months with stores running out of and limiting certain foods and supplies. Some family members have lost their jobs, but I am blessed to be able to help my family, including those back home in the Philippines, with support.

We are blessed to have church service on Zoom, as some churches do not have the capability and/or technology. As a choir member, I am missing the active singing and sharing of God's music. I want to thank my church family for the opportunity to lead ministry teams as this helps strengthen my faith. I pray for us all and for our church that God would give us rest in mind, body, and soul. My peace and love be with all of you. God bless.
