Session

Session met virtually in a Regular (Stated) Meeting at 7:00 pm. on Thursday, December 14, 2023, with the Rev. Karen Thistlethwaite as guest moderator. A quorum was present. These following motions were approved unanimously:

- Following review, to recommend the 2024 budget to the congregation at their annual congregational meeting on January 28, 2024.
- To transfer \$25,000 from the Synod account to the church's checking account.

Holding meetings electronically: The new Book of Order requires that congregations should adopt special rules of order and standing rules to govern meetings held electronically to an in-person otherwise meeting. Following discussion. this motion was approved that Session grant that the unanimously: congregation and its committees may meet electronically, provided that the technology employed allows for all members present to hear and be heard simultaneously.

Additionally, recognizing that for some, any actions taken at a session meeting on Zoom (before the new Book of Order affirmed Zoom meetings) may be called into question, the Session affirms that all actions taken since the Session started meeting on Zoom in 2020 should be upheld.

The next Regular (Stated) Meeting of Session is Thursday, January 18, 2024.

Celebrating Our Journey

This year, 2024, comes with the 75th anniversary of our church. That's right! On May 22, 1949, our church was formally organized and became part of the Presbyterian denomination.

So, in preparation for this special event, we will be sharing some history with you. On the first and third Sunday of each month leading up to our church celebration on May 19, 2024, you will hear someone briefly speaking about our church's past. It will be called "A Minute for History." You will also read important little known facts which we call "Did You Know?"

Did You Know?

Our first sanctuary was a tiny, all-purpose Quonset hut chapel moved from College-City Lakeside Presbyterian Church and was called the "Sugar Cube Building."

Our first structure, the Sugar Cube Building,was also where movies were shown to the local children on the weekends until the Sierra Theater was built on Junipero Serra Boulevard.

The doors to the first temporary sanctuary opened on February 20, 1949.

A portable vacuum cleaner powered the church organ. The vacuum cleaner was stolen and this vandalism reached the Associated Press!

In 1958, Greg Lum and Ken Gillespie became the first men to join the Board of Deacons.

At one time, sacred music was broadcast from an aluminum speaker in our steeple.

In the early '60's, we had our first electronic organ installed in memory of Margaret Pauline Brown, a longtime friend and member of our church. She was an educator and pioneer in our area for whom an elementary school on Eastmoor Avenue, Daly City, is named.

The church choir was seen on KPIX-TV in 1958, 1959, and in 1960.

The first pews were painted gray and were donated by a local mortuary.

Our sanctuary was open for use on Palm Sunday 1957. The sanctuary cost \$68,000 and the rugs that graced the floor cost \$5,000.

The first tables were wooden and had screw-on metal legs. When not in use, they were kept in a recessed area under the stage in Tweedie Hall, our social hall.
