Ever since COVID-19 has forced suspension of our annual Fall Feast featuring turkey sandwich and apple pie lunches, the PW Coordinating Team has wished for the “good old days” when the Feast proceeds could be donated to mission. Wanting to continue benevolence for others, in lieu of the Fall Feast, we are hosting a project to benefit the youth in the Bilingual Afterschool Program at Cameron House and seek your donations for this cause.

Cameron House has its roots in being a rescue house or shelter for young girls or women who were forced to be slaves in Chinatown. Founded in 1874, Cameron House has a unique place in the heart of San Francisco, serving changing needs of individuals and families in the community for generations. Their mission is to empower the APPI community to build strength and resilience through family centered programs.

Suggested dollar amounts of donations: \$10 for afternoon snacks; \$15 for ESL materials; \$20 for sports equipment. Checks payable to Presbyterian Women, with BAP on the memo line, may be sent to our treasurer, Margie King, or to the church office. Timeline of project: Begin now, ending October 22, 2022.
